**Hon. Owii:** Thank you very much, Mr. Deputy Speaker. Allow me to take this opportunity to present the Paper on County Assembly Committees and Membership.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** You are allowed.

*(Hon. Owii laid the document on the Table)*

### NOTICE OF MOTION

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** I can lend you my copy Hon. K'owii. Hon. K'owii are you proceeding with the notice of Motion?

**Hon. Owii:** Thank you very much, Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir. I want to put in notice Motion:-

**THAT** pursuant to section 59 (d) of the County Government Act, 2012 this House adopts the Eleven Months Report of the Siaya County Public Service Board for the period from January 2014 to November 2014.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. K'owii, a notice had been given to that effect. I believe the notice that you should be giving is for the membership, the Paper that you just laid on the Table.

**Hon. Owii:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, they were two because-- one actually the deliberations all the same had started, but was interrupted. Now I want to give a notice of Motion:-

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you. Next Order!

**MOTION****ADOPTION OF THE ELEVEN MONTHS REPORT  
OF THE  
SIAYA COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD**

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Deputy Leader of Majority, Hon. K'owii.

**Hon. Owii:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker.

Pursuant to section 59 (d) of the County Government Act, 2012 this House adopts the Eleven Months Report of the Siaya County Public Service Board for the period from January 2014 to November 2014.

Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, the debate on the same was interrupted today and we as the Assembly accepted that we will continue with the debate in the afternoon. Thank you, Sir.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you. Hon. Members, as you are aware, this matter had been before this House in the morning session and it was deferred to the afternoon session and the debate can now proceed. The matter had been moved and seconded. I believe the Chair had proposed the question. Yes and it is now time for debate. Hon. Ndonji.

**Hon. Ndonji:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir I normally like doing what I think is right. This pamphlet was given to us in the morning and I doubt if people can go through this report within the time that we were given and come and give constructive arguments on the said matter. So, am requesting that we be given more time so that by the time we are coming, we've already gone through it using a toothcomb and come up with all the points that we are going to raise. I request Hon. Elisha Okuku to second.

**Hon. Okuku:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, I rise to second that Members be given more time so that we can ventilate maturely.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Madialo, you seem to be having something burning inside you.

**Hon. Madialo:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, the Hon. Member has rightly pointed out that certain things must be done right and ---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** And for that purpose I can see the direction you are taking. Can you then allow me to say a word before you proceed?

**Hon. Madialo:** So that you make a final ruling, let me---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** I was just asking myself whether we should propose the question or whether I should give about two or three Members time also to contribute on the same before I propose the question. Therefore, I start with you.

**Hon. Madialo:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, I wanted to point out this; section 59 (d) of the County Government Act stipulates that a report will be prepared by the County Public Service Board. The report is then gazetted and once it's gazetted, that is when it is a report that can be handled by the Assembly. The gazette notice that has this report should be attached here so that what we debate on is what is in the report. We don't know whether what was gazetted is what is reported to us.

*(Applause)*

Mr. Deputy Speaker, with due respect to the Majority Leader, a committee will have to look at whether the contents here and the contents in the gazetted document are the same and before we even debate and adopt it, confirm to the Assembly that what is here is what was gazetted. So, Mr. Deputy Speaker, I do know for certain that there's a gazetted copy that was presented to us.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Just proceed.

**Hon. Madialo:** I will be quite comfortable in debating this if the gazetted one is attached to this, so that we can counter check whether what is known officially by the Government as what was done by the Public Service Board is what is in front of us.

*(Applause)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Any other Member? Any more contributions? Hon. Aneme I can read from your eyes that you are having something.

**Hon. Aneme:** I was just winking that you end it. It's complete!

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Okello, are you also winking?

**Hon. Okello:** I am winking, Mr. Deputy Speaker, but I wanted to agree with the sentiments of the Chair, hon. Madialo that the document is indeed bulky and for purposes of procedure and ownership, my thinking was that the document be committed to a certain committee of the House i.e. Delegated Legislation or any other committee for that matter for them to look at it with a tooth comb just as Hon. Ndonji put it. Because Mr. Deputy Speaker, there certain issues in this report that may need counter checking and confirmation and Members in their individual capacities may not have the commitment especially on time to be able to do that. So, my imagination was that it be committed to a Committee of the House which will then report back having taken the ownership of the same and having counterchecked the necessary provisions in this report. We need to debate this from a total point of information Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir. Thank you.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Maurey. Yes, give him the microphone.

**Hon. Asewe:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. Apart from the technicalities that have been cited by our learned friend hon. Madialo, the time we were given to go through this document is short. Remember that after the adjournment, we were supposed to go through this document but we were engaged in another very important discussion concerning the tractors. So, apart from the technicalities that are coming up, we need more time to go through the same document so that we debate on what we understand and what we have gone through. Thank you.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Ok, thank you, hon. Members. I have heard your sentiments and it's clear that as an Assembly, this is the place we have to debate and agree on certain issues. You will recall that in the National Assembly, some Bills have been passed that people have termed as premature and they elicited some reactions. We don't want that to happen in Siaya and from the reasons that you have raised, it is clear that Members need to be given adequate time to look at the document.

Another issue that has been raised is whether procedure was followed. I have consulted some statutes and it's clear that in the past, this same Board had presented a report before this Assembly and it is quite different-- The channel that they followed is a bit different from what they have done today.

So, I will therefore direct that this document to be taken to the committee on Delegated, Legislation, Justice and Legal Affairs so that it's that committee that will forward this report to this House for further action. It's so ordered!

ADOPTION OF THE REPORT  
OF THE AMENDED SIAYA COUNTY ASSEMBLY  
COMMITTEES MEMBERSHIP

**Hon. Owii:** Yes Sir. I want to move a Motion:-

**THAT** this House adopts the report of the Amended Siaya County Assembly Committees Membership laid on the Table of the House today, Wednesday, 18th February, 2015.

I had laid, Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir.

**Hon. Members:** Where are they?

**Hon. Owii:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, I was thinking the entire Membership was having what I have, because I had mine to lay on the Table. Most unfortunate it appears that each and every one is not having. But, allow me to explain one point Sir.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Move on.

**Hon. Owii:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, going through the list of names of the hon. Members in various committees; I learn that very few of the Members decided to move from one committee to the other. So, when we were counting, the people that used that opportunity that was given did not even reach seven. So, I was opting that I would read the names of hon. Members that decided to move to committees which they never belonged to in the past. If you can allow, but generally all the entire membership remain as---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Before I allow you, maybe you can call for a Seconder, then I will give you time after that.

**Hon. Owii:** Thank you, Sir, let me call hon. Gare to second.

**Hon. Agoko:** Point of order, Sir!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Yes, hon. Agoko what is your point of order?

**Hon. Agoko:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Thank you so much. I have come to realize that the office of Leader of Majority is a usurping the powers of the Committee on Selection. I just don't know if today an individual purports to take all the responsibilities of the committee on Selection.

*(Applause)*

It will be therefore an illegality Mr. Deputy Speaker, to be discussing or debating the same.

Hon. Deputy Speaker: Hon. Agoko, who is the Chairman of Selection Committee?

**Hon. Agoko:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, I am talking about deliberations of a committee, not the recommendations of an individual.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** I have only asked who the Chairman of that committee is.

**Hon. Agoko:** The Chairman is the Leader of Majority and I am a Member of that committee and no meeting has ever been held Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir. So, what is being tabled here is a creation of the Deputy and the Leader of Majority. The two of them and then it's brought for us here alleging that it has been discussed by the committee. I am a Member of that committee, I have never heard of any notification of the same. I have never had any time to discuss on the same. It is an illegality Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, to take time to talk on the same.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Deputy Leader of Majority, can you respond?

**Hon. Owii:** Thank you very much, Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir. Most unfortunate, I thought hon. Agoko wasn't aware that the Leader of Majority is the Chair of the Selection Committee and the direction that was given by the Chair yesterday, is what we responded to and the product of the same is that each and every Member that had a feeling of maybe putting a request to move to another committee, that window was given the whole of yesterday and some of the Members that are here Sir, decided to use that particular window. And that is why we opted just to mention the names of those who have moved from one committee to another and maybe they have decided to discontinue being in other committees. That is the position.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** You know the Chair may not know who and who sat, where did they sit and when did they sit. Whatever comes before the Assembly must be ---. I believe from the sentiments of the Leader of Majority, this matter had been discussed here yesterday or a directive was given by the Speaker and therefore what they did was a follow up on the direction that was given. I will therefore, ask hon. K'owii, that your motion be seconded. Then we can proceed from there

**Hon. Owii:** Thank you very much, Mr. Deputy Speaker, I want to request hon. Gare to second.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Gare. You know any sentiments that you want to raise, there will be a time for that.

**Hon. Owii:** Certainly.

*(Hon. Gare stood to second)*

*(Question proposed)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** The debate can now proceed. Hon. Agoko

**Hon. Agoko:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker, Sir, I brought to your attention that this is a House of rules and order and it's unfortunate if the Chair purports to overlook the same. This is a House of rules and order where we legislate and when we are doing legislation we also have to abide to the same. We cannot assume that what the Leader of Majority is presenting to us is legitimate while am putting to your attention that I am a Member of that committee and we never sat to discuss the same. No single time---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Agoko, you know I told you that there would be time for do that, do not go back to what you had raised earlier that---

**Hon. Agoko:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, you had overlooked the same!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** No, not that the Chair overlooked it. You know when the Speaker is talking you have to take your seat. I had given direction that then Motion be moved and then it be seconded. If there is any sentiments for or against, then that will come later and this is now the time. Fine, you can proceed now.

**Hon. Agoko:** It was therefore my humble appeal Mr. Deputy Speaker, that the Chair, directs that this document be committed to the Committee on Selection for discussion and review so that we actually ensure that each and every Member is in the right committee, that things are okay as per the way and wishes of Members. I therefore request your Chair that before this document is adopted, it be committed to the Committee on Selection. I call on hon. Angul to second.

**Hon. Owiti:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Angul, I can only give you time to contribute, then a decision shall be made. You know when you talk about procedure and rules; you also have to obey that. We are now debating and therefore at some point, I'll have to give direction. You don't propose, you know another person will come with a counter proposal. So, the best thing, the procedure that you are talking about hon. Agoko is that a Motion shall be moved then it's seconded then it's open for debate. Now at the time for debate, that is when you raise the issues that you are raising. Then the Speaker has got his ears, he will know how the Motion is moving and the sentiments and the feelings of Members. Then Speaker has a feeling like the ones you are having. Do not think that the Speaker is blind and dumb.

Fine, so hon. Angul, I can only give you a chance if you want to contribute. At the end of all contributions that is when the Speaker can give directions. We have to follow procedure the way hon. Agoko is putting it.

**Hon. Owiti:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. I also will contribute on this list as a Member of the Selection Committee that the procedure that hon. Agoko and other Members of the Selection Committee are complaining about is genuine because we as the Members of the Committee, we have not been called in any meeting concerning those people who are changing from one committee to another. And if I may give example on Budget Committee--

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** You need not to go to the list. Just make your contribution

**Hon. Owiti:** Ok, I will concur with hon. Agoko that the thing needs to be at least---

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** I only want to get sentiments from members of Selection Committee. Hon. Odinga, are you a member of the committee?

**Hon. Odinga:** I am

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Ok. Proceed!

**Hon. Odinga:** Thank you. As I have indicated earlier, I am a member of the Selection Committee. As you have said, we need to obey rules and orders. We need to go by whatever we passed in our Standing Orders. As a member of that committee, this is the first time I'm seeing this list.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** But are you of the opinion that we need to defer it or we proceed with it?

**Hon. Odinga:** Mr. Deputy Speaker, I'm coming to that in a few minutes time. We need to clear the air on this Mr. Deputy Speaker. There is a word which was used that there was a window, that there was a directive given by the Speaker that Members can move from

one committee to another, but I don't believe that it was said that laid out procedures should not be followed. The window was that Members who want to change from one committee to the other can do that and then the Selection Committee will be called to go through it, then the Chair to present it. I think that is the correct procedure. So, my opinion is that this list should go back to the Selection Committee and then it comes in a procedural way. Thank you.

*(Hon. Okuku stood up at his place)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Gare. Hon. Elisha, you have contributed!

**Hon. Okuku:** Surely!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Oh, I'll give you a chance

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Gare:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. I'm a member of the Selection Committee and of course the vice Chair. This list has come today because this was a directive from the Chair yesterday that Members who would wish to move from one committee to the other give their names to the Chair who is the Majority Leader so that he (Majority Leader) can insert their names in the various committees they want and the list be brought today. In fact, in the morning! Mr. Deputy Speaker, as you are aware, we cannot call a committee meeting on Wednesday because we have Assembly sittings. That is why the Chair of Selection, after discussing with the very few Members who wanted to move from one committee to another, the list had to be brought today because it was a directive from the Chair. If the same Chair now directs that it should be taken back, we don't have a problem, we'll do it. We were working as per the directives of the Chair. Thank you

*(Several Hon. Members stood up in their places)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** I only need to get the contribution of two more Members. Only Members of the Committee. Hon. Apiyo Apiyo, then I'll come to hon. Sela.

**Hon. Apiyo:** Thank you. Mr. Deputy Speaker, there is an issue, even if we have to adopt this report. From what I have seen, I would say that we thrash this document because how can one Member appear eight times! I don't want to mention names. This is why we want the Selection Committee to go and scrutinize this document.

**Hon. Okwako:** We have a lot of debts Mr. Deputy Speaker. We have loans and mortgage to pay. I was quarrelling because I got few days and I want to pay my loan. Why should we quarrel and talk like children over this?

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Sela, we don't come to committees to pay loans!

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Okwako:** Yes, that's not the case, but people suffer!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Ok---

**Hon. Okwako:** Let me finish!

*(Laughter)*

I was to have three meetings. Now, if I get those four, I will have achieved my goal!

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** So, hon. Sela, would you want us to proceed with this or we defer it?

**Hon. Okwako:** If I get my number, no problem!

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Anastasia

**Hon. Augo:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. I have a point of correction. I'm in the Committee of Tourism Conservation----

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Don't go to that yet---

**Hon. Augo:** No, my name is not Hon. Anastasia Achieng' Auko. I am Anastasia Akinyi Augo

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Ok. The Chair has taken note of that

*(Hon. Okuku ordered out of the House for making unsubstantiated allegations)*

**Hon. Awuor:** What he was saying was not even adding any value.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Members, at some point it's good to live to the title of being honourable and we have to respect the business of this Assembly, we have to respect ourselves and the sentiments that we make. Remember that whatever you say today shall remain on record and generations to come even after 100 years will be able to refer to what this August House was discussing and our individual contributions. Therefore, we should always be keen and careful with our sentiments.

Let us proceed. Hon. Muhulah

**Hon. Muhulah:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. Indeed we are saddened by what has just happened because as Hon. Members, it is important that we conduct ourselves with a lot of decorum.

However, Mr. Deputy Speaker, I stand this afternoon to remind this hon. House that this is a House of rules and procedures. The essence of constituting committees is to discuss deliberations and directives that come from the hon. Speaker's Chair. One of them was that window that was given. But that window did not bar the concerned committee from sitting and deliberating. I want to appreciate the work that was done by the Chair and the Deputy because they made a list, but I think it would have been very much nice if the whole committee verified and agreed on the documentation of that list Mr. Deputy Speaker. That is what will hold the authenticity and credibility of that committee. The Select Committee should have sat down and done the list for it to have the blessings of all the committee Members before it is brought to this House. Doing such things is setting the wrong precedence because next time, some two people or few members of a committee will sit and bring a document without deliberations and it will be contested.

In that manner, we do accept and agree with the list, but I would plead that the House gives the committee the chance to sit and come back as a committee supporting the document Mr. Deputy Speaker.

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, I'm giving chance to the last contributor. Hon. Madialo. Or you had contributed?

**Hon. Madialo:** I only opposed that ---- Mr. Deputy Speaker, but let me support something. Mr. Deputy Speaker, I would have wished to say that the sentiments directed at the list should be reserved for a Motion to amend for purposes of meeting the gender rule which obviously is not observed here. The numbers here are beyond the limits prescribed by law. We must know also that the House moves with the engine of committees. So that, if we were to suggest that we go back and sit to have longer committee membership, then in essence, all the documents that we have committed to the committees will stand still until the Majority Leader and his office comes up with the membership of those committees. This entails that even the Committee of Finance and Budget must not sit to look at the Supplementary Budget until the Majority Leader comes up with a list that is adopted. Can we afford it?

So, Mr. Deputy Speaker, this is a technicality. Let us look at the substance of what we do on behalf of the people. Can the technicality that we are addressing be allowed to be a barrier to doing what we were elected to do? Or worse, we don't do a supplementary budget because the Finance Committee cannot sit because it does not exist. And the nurses, doctors and ECD teachers who have nothing to do with what we are doing here are made to go without their salaries because we cannot agree on how the committees were constituted. I think Mr. Deputy Speaker that will be putting procedure as the master of substance, which should not happen. May I add that the Majority Leader perhaps has invited this argument, because this is not a report. This is a list brought by leaders of a political party telling the Assembly that our political party wants the following in the following committees. That's why when you go to the Standing Orders; it says the Select Committee should have the Majority Leader and Minority Leader. The reason is that both leaders will bring Members from their parties and any other party in the Assembly that is recognised will bring Members. Mr. Deputy Speaker, the Majority Leader in this case is a figurehead. The person we are supposed to blame is the Whip because it is the Whip that whips people to committees and it is the Whip that brings a list of the people given to him/her by the political parties to these committees. But you see we are talking about this as if we are supposed to be all of us. This is simply because we are all CORD. If KANU was here, it would come with its own membership, hon. K'owii would not be answering for KANU.

So, Mr. Deputy Speaker, this is one of the mischiefs that perhaps we tried to cure, but which we might have to go back to because it is us who changed the Standing Orders that added these numbers. In normal circumstances, the Selection Committee is supposed to be made up of certain individuals recognised by parties only, plus the Speaker and his deputy. They are usually five. So, in the process of accommodating 20 people, this is what we end up with. Mr. Deputy Speaker, I stand to support that we adopt this list, but with your direction that this office goes back and ensures that where we are only men, ladies are brought in to balance up the gender rule. Thank you.

**Hon. Okello:** Thank you, Mr. Deputy Speaker. Very unfortunate that some of my contributions have since been overtaken by contribution from the Chair, hon. Madialo. But where I want to highlight as a matter of concern is that there is a reason why structures even in organizations have leadership and I believe that when a committee for instance has leadership in the name of a Chair and a vice, there are certain functions that can be dispensed adequately by the two on behalf of the others. There are certain things that we don't have to attend to as a whole Assembly which can be handled by the Speaker and the Deputy. So, from where I stand, it is quite in order that certain functions can be dispensed adequately by the Chair and vice Chairs of the various committees that we have. I want to believe that since this was not a report just as hon. Madialo has highlighted, it was a list and given the circumstances and the procedures that preceded the presentation of this list, it was quite in order for the Chair and the vice Chair in consultation to bring this list. Again in consideration of very important activities, this morning we had a very critical debate on the issue of agriculture. If we spend a lot of time on this list it means the issues we raised cannot be addressed. We have issues to do with roads, Miss Tourism currently going on and I am sure hon. Abayo and his committee are keen on that.

So, Mr. Deputy Speaker, the continuous working of the committees, just as hon. Madialo has said should not be halted due to such technicalities. So, I want to submit that I am for the idea that we adopt this list as it were and stand by the direction that the committee goes to look at it by taking into consideration issues of gender. But also for me, most importantly for the purposes of functionality of committees, if you allow me to give an example. A committee where I sit called Implementation committee has overtime struggled with availability of members. This could be the right moment for the selection committee to beef up and strengthen the Implementation Committee as an example so that the committee can serve its purposes to the expectations of this House and according to the Standing Orders and other rules that guide the operations of this House. Thank you

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you. Hon. Members, I wish to thank you for your open debate over the list that has been presented before this House. I have heard your contributions and concerns. The issue at stake is whether to subject this list for a vote or whether to defer it. I wish to say the following before we can do either.

When it comes to formation of committees, there are rules that guide us. There are some committees that should be dissolved after a certain time and there are some where the number of membership is guided by the Standing Orders. There are committees that the Standing Orders will tell that it should not be more than, 5, 11, 12 and so on. In all committees there must be gender representation. So that if we have more women, it must balance with a certain number of men. The gender rule as per the constitution has to be followed.

**Hon. Members:** Like in Selection Committee!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Yes, like in Selection Committee where there is no female

**Hon. Members:** And Budget!

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Members, the formation of such committees should have been done by the time we were opening for this Session. However, that was never done and for us to move with speed, we need to put this matter behind us so that the Assembly business can continue. However, I do not want to rush into issues of formation of committees

because we can still do it within two or three days. So, I will direct that the Selection Committee sits and looks at the list which has been made. I believe this is just a draft. So, Members with issues can go to Members of that committee, the Chairman or vice Chairman, and then the committee will sit and make deliberations then bring us the final list by Tuesday in the afternoon. Is that agreeable to everybody?

**Hon. Members:** Yes!

**Hon. Gare:** So, there's no sittings between now and Tuesday?

**Hon. Deputy Speaker:** No! Hon. Members, you are aware that we have been sitting in our committees, so there is nothing that will bar us from sitting in any other committee. So, in the interim, the committees will continue sitting the way we've been sitting. Any committee that had been scheduled earlier to sit will proceed with their businesses. So, I direct that the Selection Committee brings a fresh list by Tuesday in the afternoon.
